An Ordinance to provide for the use, protection, regulation, and control of Hunter's Point Park in Grant Township.

THE TOWNSHIP OF GRANT, KEWEENAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Short Title

This Ordinance may be known and referred to as the "Hunter's Point Park Ordinance", and is adopted pursuant to MCL 42.421 et. seq.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: This Ordinance is adopted to regulate Hunter's Point Park, for the general health, safety and wellbeing of the park and the users thereof. The Township Board is authorized to amend and supplement these rules by resolution, as it deems necessary.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: The following rules are adopted as to Hunter's Point Park located at Copper Harbor, Grant Township:

- There shall be no glass containers in the park.
- 2. All pets in the beach and picnic areas shall be leashed. or caged.
- 3. Trash containers are for park related activities, only. No household garbage or trash shall be placed in the containers. No dumping is allowed.
- 4. No vehicles and/or motorized vehicles are allowed. <u>"Vehicles" includes, but is not limited to, non powered vehicles such as bicycles.</u> "Motorized vehicles" includes, but is not limited to, cars, motorcycles, RVs, snowmobiles, four-wheelers, go-carts, and scooters.
 - There shall be no open fires, including campfires.
 - There shall be no overnight camping.
 - Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed or possessed in the park.
 - 8. There shall be no excessive noise.
- 9. There shall be no removal of natural resources, including rocks or stones. There shall be no disturbing vegetation, living or dead. Plants, living or dead, may not be removed.
 - Firearms may not be possessed or discharged in the park.
 - 11. Fireworks may not be possessed or discharged in the park.

ECTION 4: Park users may be provided notice of regulations by posting or by leaving printed aterial in the park areas.

THE TOWNSHIP OF GRANT, KEWEENAW COUNTY, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Short Title

This Ordinance may be known and referred to as the "Hunter's Point Park Ordinance," and is adopted pursuant to MCL 42.421 et, seq.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance is adopted to regulate Hunter's Point Park, for the general health, safety, and wellbeing of the park and the users thereof. The Township Board is authorized to amend and supplement these rules by resolution, as it deems necessary.

SECTION 3: The following rules are adopted as to Hunter's Point Park located at Copper Harbor, Grant Township and include property owned by Grant Township in Sections 29, 30, 31 and 32 of T.58-59N. – R.28W.

- 1. There shall be no glass containers in the park.
- 2. All pets shall be leashed.
- 3. Trash containers are for park related activities, only. No household garbage or trash shall be placed in the containers. No dumping is allowed.
- 4. Vehicles are permitted only on access roads, including North Coast Shores Road, Harbor Coast Lane, and the Hunter's Point Parking Lot. "Vehicles" includes, but is not limited to, non-powered vehicles, such as bicycles, as well as motorized vehicles, such as cars, motorcycles, RVs, snowmobiles, four-wheelers, go-carts, and scooters. Bicycles are also permitted on the north and south Biking/Hiking Trails located north of M-26.
- 5. There shall be no open fires, including campfires.

- 6. There shall be no overnight camping.
- 7. Alcoholic beverages may not be consumed or possessed in the park.
- 8. There shall be no excessive noise.
- There shall be no removal of natural resources, including rocks or stones. There shall be no disturbing vegetation, living or dead. Plants, living or dead, may not be removed.
- 10. Firearms shall not be discharged in the park.
- 11. Fireworks may not be possessed or discharged in the park.
- SECTION 4: Park users may be provided notice of regulations by posting or by leaving printed material in the park areas.
- SECTION 5. A Committee of 3 members nominated by the Township Supervisor and appointed by the Grant Township Board will oversee the management of Hunter's Point Park. Membership on the Committee shall be for a period of 4 years. It is intended that the appointments shall be made on election years. To implement this process the initial appointments shall be made in 2014. One member shall be appointed for a 2-year term and 2 members for 4-year terms. After the initial appointments the appointments will be made at the annual Township Business Meeting. The Committee shall select one of its members to act as Chairman. The Committee shall be responsible for overseeing the maintenance of the park, regulating its use, and developing the annual budget. The Committee Chairman shall report to the Township Board monthly.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.
